I recently received the following from Andy and thought some of our older readers would like this passed on. - Pat

Although my wife and I have been in Christchurch for over 6 years now this is my first item for The Heron. I hope it is O.K. as it's a mini obituary for someone born here in 1920.

'Walter Woolner (aka Doug) 1920 - 2011

Walter Woolner (as he was christened but known to me as Doug) was born on the 16th November 1920 to Edith Ellen and Arthur Charles, the youngest of seven children, in Christchurch. Life was tough in the early days and Walter was only a year old when his father passed away. With his mum working to make ends meet, Walter was entrusted to the care of his older siblinas.

Walter grew up in Christchurch, driving the shire horses pulling the plough when he was only 11 or 12 years old. Academically bright and a good footballer, the future looked bright and at one point he had trials with Arsenal football club, among others. However, football wasn't really a good way to make a living back then and it is most likely he would have followed his brothers Jack and Bill into trades at some point, but then along came the war.

Initially Walter worked for De-Haviland in Hatfield, most famous for the Mosquito fighter bomber. He worked in the drawing office as a draughtsman, but not long after the outbreak of the war, he signed up with the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve and after an initial period in the U.K. was shipped out to the Cocus Keeling Islands in 1943. There are lots stories about the journey there which involved aircraft, trains and boats. When he was de-mobbed in June 1946, it was at Kirkham in Lancashire. His discharge papers stated him to be of very good character and of superior skills.

After leaving the RAF Walter went to St. Helens and with his talent in 'administrative organisation' he found the perfect job - driving a bus. It was whilst working on the buses, over 60 years ago that Walter met his future wife, Jean.

They married in 1957 on the 16th November, in the very Church in Haydock where his funeral service was held. They had two boys, Leslie and Robin.'

To close I quite one of his remarks which was "I don't know how I ever got to be 90. I've been bombed, torpedoed, machine gunned, not to mention falling down a well when I was four and only saved by my braces."

Walter is remembered by some of the longer standing residents of our village, including Walter Chamberlain, Wolsey Rolfe and Mary Rolfe.

My original connection with the family came through Robin, their younger son, who encouraged me to become a St. Helens fan and through that I subsequently had the privilege of meeting Doug and Jean. So when we were moving here in 2005 and I said to Robin, "Oh, it's a small village in Cambridgeshire", little did I know that my friend's father was born here.
