Victory at last: £85,000 safety work set to start on Bedlam Bridge after four-year campaign

ROAD safety campaigners will celebrate victory this month as \pounds 85,000 improvement work starts at Bedlam Bridge, near March.

Graham Chappell, founder of the Fenland Road Safety Campaign (Charlotte's Way), has campaigned since 2008 to get the barriers, raising thousands of pounds to help pay for them. The campaign was launched after the death of nine-year-old Charlotte Walker, who died when the car she was travelling in left the road and plunged into the water near Bedlam Bridge.

Four years later, safety work is about to start at the bridge, which dates back to the 1960s.

Cambridgeshire County Council, which is joint funding the improvements, will begin phase one of the work on November 26.



Bedlam Bridge has been the scene of several road accidents.

Fencing will be installed on the southern side of the bridge, while the northern side will be improved after Christmas. Mr Chappell said:

"Through a Local Highway Improvement bid, Charlotte's Way and the county council have jointly funded a scheme to improve the safety of Bedlam Bridge and the adjacent junction.
"A panel of county councillors assessed all the bids on set criteria such as safety and community impact and the Charlotte's Way proposal scored the highest out of all rural Fenland bids."

The work on the southern side of the junction is expected to take around three weeks to complete with temporary traffic signals operating between 7am and 7pm, Monday to Friday.

Councillor Tony Orgee, cabinet member for community infrastructure, said: "I am delighted that by working together with the road safety campaign we have been able to identify the funding for the safety improvements at the Bedlam Bridge junction."

NE Cambs MP Steve Barclay has supported the campaign last year persuading Roads Minister Mike Penning to visit Bedlam Bridge.

Lucky escape for driver

A woman had a lucky escape after fire crews found her car teetering on the edge of a five-feet deep ditch.

The fire service was called to Byall Fen Drove, in Manea, Thursday 8 November at 9.15am to reports of a car off the road. When they arrived, they found the vehicle balancing over the ditch.

Two fire crews from March and Chatteris, a rescue vehicle from Huntingdon, an ambulance crew and the Magpas Helimedix team all worked together at the scene to rescue the

woman, who suffered a head injury and neck pain. The driver, who is in her 30s, was trapped in her vehicle so once fire crews had stabilised the car, they worked to free her.

They used cutting equipment to remove the roof and safely remove her from the car. She was taken to Peterborough City Hospital in a land ambulance, where on arrival she was in a stable condition. Story courtesy of Fenland Citizen



Online scam prompts police warning

POLICE are warning Cambridgeshire residents about an online scam that is attempting to trick web users out of hundreds of pounds.

The scam involves a message flashing up on the screen causing the computer to lock. It claims to be from the Metropolitan Police and informs the user they must pay a ± 100 fine in order to unlock the computer.

Two recent incidents have happened in Swaffham Bulbeck, where a 62-year-old man paid the money using a card but managed to cancel it before any money had left his account, and in High Barns, Ely, where a 29-year-old man paid using a voucher in a local shop.

The fraud operates through malicious software which infects personal computers after users have accessed certain websites.

Detective Sergeant John Yore said:

An example of the fraudulent message that flashes up on the computer screen

"This is a fraud and we would urge people not to pay out any money or hand out any bank details. Genuine law enforcement agencies would never contact members of the public via email and demand funds in this way.

"We would advise anyone who has been deceived by such a message and handed their banking details over to report the matter to the card issuer immediately and call police."

In order to reduce the chances of being infected by this or similar malware police recommend that anti-virus software is both used and, importantly, routinely updated to keep pace with new threats as they are discovered.

Bedlam Bridge Safety Barrier Installation Begins!

The long awaited joint Cambs County Council/FRSC funded safety barrier installation at Bedlam Bridge is now underway. Cambs CC have kindly extended the scheme beyond the south parapet adjacent installation proposed by FRSC, and have embarked on an £85K program of safety improvements to both sides of the bridge. The south parapet work is scheduled for completion by 14th December. Work on the north parapet will commence after Christmas.

Road Safety Week

After four years of campaigning for all Year 11 students in Fenland schools to be introduced to the powerful 'Brake' (national road safety charity) '2Young2Die' DVD and supporting educational material for prospective young drivers, this year's Road Safety Week (19-25 November), saw this aim finally achieved.

Presentations were given to well over 1000 students at all the secondary schools in Fenland, (apart from Wisbech Grammar School, who have yet to take up the offer), plus Downham Mkt High School, by FRSC supporters (including the incredibly brave Michelle Lynch, who lost her son Jordan (7), and first husband, Dean in an immersion accident on the Forty Foot Bank, in December 2005), and school staff. The presentations and DVD have been incredibly well received by both students and staff, and we are hopeful of repeating the program for next year's Year 11.

It's a huge breakthrough given the exceptional risk of serious and fatal accidents that young drivers and their passengers have faced here in the Fens, for many years.

Other News – Welney, and The North Bank road.

A meeting has taken place between Campaign supporters and one of Norfolk County Council's traffic engineers regarding options for improvement of safety at the 90degree bend on the A1101, approaching Welney from Lakes End, where 19 year old Megan Warner, died in an immersion accident in May 2009. More news to follow in due course.

Negotiations are also underway with senior Pboro City Council officials, re safety improvement proposals for the North Bank road

MINUTES OF THE CHRISTCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY 10th SEPTEMBER 2012 – MEMORIAL HALL CHRISTCHURCH AT 7:30pm

Present: Councillors – Jacky Wincote (Chair), Nigel Russell, Jill Bliss, Simon Freeland, William Beswick, Hannah Poole, Will Sutton (FDC) and Fred Yeulett (CCC).

Stephen Cowell (Clerk) and 5 members of the public were also in attendance. In addition Jane Andrews-Gauvain attended the meeting for item 3.

1. Welcome and Apologies

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting.

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. Cotterell MBE (FDC) and PCSO Russ.

2. Signing of Minutes

The minutes of the 10th September meeting were signed, by the Chair, as true record of the meeting.

3. Presentation by Jane Andrews-Gauvain on a Biodiversity project being run by the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Environmental Records Centre

Jane introduced herself and explained her role in trying to record environmental information in Cambridgeshire. She explained what the project is trying to achieve and requested help from the public in recording the wildlife in and around Christchurch leaving a number of posters and leaflets detailing the project she is working on. The Council agreed to include details of her project in the next edition of The Heron. Jane answered questions from both councillors and residents and left the meeting at the end of the presentation.

4. Disclosure and Declarations of Pecuniary Interests

The Clerk summarised the new rules for the declaration of interests. No interests where declared.

5. Update on action points from previous meeting

It was reported that:

- Highways are aiming to start repairs on the bridge at Cotton's Corner on the 15th October. The fact that the bridge does not comply to current standards was reported to the Council and that in the longer term a change in design may be required. Repairs are due to start on repairing Bedlam Bridge on 19th November and the bridge will have additional safety features installed.
- A letter has been sent to the resident whose brambles are growing over the footpath near to the School and they have been cut back to some degree.
- Highways have added replacing the knocked down crossroad sign near to the Padgett's Road / Church Road junction to their list of works. Cllr. Sutton reported that a tree branch had fallen over one of the other road signs near this junction but that has now been removed.

6. Public Adjournment

Members of the public commented on the following:

- Could Roddons be asked to help with overgrown hedges at properties belonging to them?
- Better signs are required to make people aware that the Recreation Ground is a no dogs area. Clerk to obtain costing.
- There is a lot of rubbish at the Skateboard Park. An additional rubbish bin was requested. Council members explained the issues with get FDC to empty it and reminded all that as part of the deal for putting the Skateboard Park there the children agreed to put rubbish in the bin near to the Crown Drove entrance to the Recreation Ground which is emptied by FDC. It was agreed to put a notice in The Heron asking users to keep the area tidy.
- The extent of damage to the Youth Shelter following the recent fire was requested. It was reported that paintwork had been damaged but the structure was still undamaged.
- An update on the move to reduce the speed limit through Church Road/Upwell Road was requested. The Clerk reported that the new signs have been purchased and that he is liaising with the contractors and the Highways Department and expects the 30mph speed limit to be in force during the week commencing 5th November. A resident expressed concern over the lack of a footpath from his property into the village and the speed limit still being 60mph on the road outside his property both of which mean his son cannot walk to school and said that he will speak to members of the Council in due course about this.

• A resident requested that this agenda item be moved to later in the agenda to allow members of the public to speak to the Council following their discussions on subjects appearing later on the agenda. Members agreed to consider the request.

7. Police Update

PCSO Russ sent his apologies for not being able to attend the meeting. In the report he sent to the Council he reported that during a recent Speed Check in a 15 minutes period 14 vehicles were observed and none were breaking the speed limit.

He also reported that he has spoken again with a resident with an untidy front garden and the resident has agreed to move the rubbish from the front of the property.

8. Correspondence Received

The Clerk brought to the attention of Councillors:

- A request by a Victim Support organisation based in Huntingdon for a donation.
- A scheme to help the over 60's who have mobility issues. A notice has been placed on the village notice board regarding the scheme and a member of the public at the meeting offered to take details of it to the Good Companions club. He was thanked for the offer and given the information.
- A letter received from a resident regarding progress on the new village hall. The Clerk explained he will be
 putting an update in the November issue of the Heron so all residents are aware of the situation but has
 given the resident an answer to all his questions. It was also reported that members will be holding a brief
 meeting after the conclusion of this meeting to be briefed by the Vice-Chair and Clerk on progress made and
 decisions required to proceed.

9. County Council Street Lighting Project

The Clerk highlighted the aims of the project and explained that the replacement programme only affected those lights in Fenview and near to the Upwell Road / Sixteen Foot Bank Road junction. In the project approximately 10% of lights in the County would not be replaced but those remaining would be of a higher standard. A total of 14 lights in the village are impacted. The Clerk requested that Councillors view the areas impacted so they can form a view for discussion at the next meeting. The Clerk reported that residents affected will receive information from the County Council regarding the scheme.

10. Finance

The Clerk reported total bank balances of \pounds 56,698.12, with cheques written amounting to \pounds 4,076.68 to come from this, and brought to Councillor's attention the earmarked funds (funds that must be spent on specific purposed) that total a little over \pounds 33k.

The Clerk highlighted those items below (10.6 and 10.7) where VAT will be able to be claimed back and read out the list of play park items repaired by Sharman Fabrications. The Council agreed that it was good value for money.
