Women targeted by gang

TWO elderly women were targeted in a distraction burglary in Welney last week when four men posed as policemen.

The men entered the home of the women between 2-3.30pm last Sunday after claiming to be police officers investigating a burglary.

The women, who were both in their 60s and 70s, live in a property in Lakes End, in the village. Two of the men stayed and questioned the women while the other two went upstairs and searched the house. It is not believed that anything was stolen.

DC Steve Matthews, Operation RADAR, said: "This was a cynical claim by the offenders to con their way in to the victims' home. We would ask other residents to be vigilant and always ask for identification from any unexpected callers, even if they claim to be police officers". "You do not have to let anyone in if you are not comfortable with who they claim to be. Police officers will always be happy for you to check their authenticity or make a future appointment."

Lin Mathews, Information and Advice Assistant Manager at Age UK Norfolk said: "People who call at your home may well be genuine. However, it is a good idea to take precautions when answering the door to people you don't know." She added: "If you are not expecting a visitor Age UK Norfolk would advise you to take the following steps...

"Always lock the back door if you are answering the front door"

"Look through a window or spy-hole to see who is outside before answering."

"Ask to see identification or a proof of their identity and examine it carefully."

"Remember, you do not have to let any stranger into your home. If you are suspicious or the caller will not leave, dial 999 and ask for the police."

Three of the offenders were white and aged between 25 and 35. The fourth man is described as having a tanned complexion and aged between 35 and 40. The men may be linked to a dark blue or black Audi A6.

Officers from the Operation RADAR team are appealing for witnesses, call 101 (calls cost 15p) with any information.

Fast road too dangerous for 60mph limit' as Lotus lies in ditch

A LONG, straight road interrupted with sharp corners in Fenland is too dangerous to have a national speed limit, a resident has warned.

March Road in Tipps End has a 60mph limit but Steve Hawthorn, who lives in the road, has

called for it to be slashed after seeing a sports car come off the road into a ditch.

On Thursday 3rd May just after 6.30pm a Lotus Elise ended up in a dyke at the side of the B1100 as Mr Hawthorn was walking his dog. The driver is believed to be unhurt but Mr Hawthorn thinks next time it could be worse.

"It almost seems to be an ego thing for people to get from corner to corner as fast as possible but there are some very tight bends," said Mr Hawthorn, a musician.

"It's a 60 at the moment and people don't often stick to that. I'm amazed at how fast people drive along that road - they overtake you if you drive at a reasonable speed."

Mr Hawthorn and his wife, Marion, moved up from London last year to renovate an old coach house in the road.

He said the speed limit on the road should be cut to 30mph and an electric sign showing people their speed should be installed.

"The traffic just needs to calm down - it's a very uneven road as well," he added.

The Lotus was travelling towards March. Mr Hawthorn said he always crossed the road when approaching the corners as he knew cars would not see him if they came round the bend quickly.

"Had I been on the other side, or the car on the wrong side of the road, it could have been very nasty," he said.

MP Steve Barclay picks up road safety award from Brake and Direct Line for Fen campaigns

NORTH East Cambs MP Steve Barclay has been awarded a Road Safety Parliamentarian of the Month Award.

He's been given it by national

charity Brake and Direct Line for his successful campaign to reactivate a speed camera and install signs

to prevent further casualties on a stretch of the A47.

"Steve has also secured progress on a second campaign to install a barrier between a waterway and stretch of road in his constituency where a young girl was killed," said a Brake spokesman.

He said in April 2011, after nine crashes in three years and five deaths in six years, the MP launched a campaign with local residents and Councillor John Fish calling for a speed camera to be reactivated and warning signs installed.

"The Highways Agency agreed to install the signs, but said the £30,000 cost would have to be met by the parish council because the number of crashes on the road did not meet their stipulated level. "At this point they declined to switch the speed camera back on.

Steve then wrote to road safety minister Mike Penning MP to say how disappointed he was that the Highways Agency had not agreed to pay for the signs or reactive the camera.

The MP was also praised by Brake for getting road safety minister

Mike Penning to visit the waterway adjacent to Bedlam Bridge near to where 9 year old Charlotte Walker was tragically killed.

Mr Barclay said he was "honoured" to receive the award and said it was pleasing to see the community working together to have a minister act on their concerns.

This promises to be a happy, relaxing day, it's time to shake off the doom and gloom - come out for a day of leisure with us.



New Safety Barrier on Sixteen Foot Bank!

For anyone who hasn't recently travelled between Boots Bridge and the Chatteris end of the Sixteen Foot Bank, and may not be aware of it, I am delighted to share news that an impressive, brand new stretch of safety barrier has very recently been installed at Broad Alder Farm Bridge, Stonea, replacing an earlier installation that was in a poor state of repair. Area Traffic Manager, John Richards, has confirmed that this installation cost around £20,000, and was undertaken as a part of the now ongoing county-wide safety barrier maintenance and repair programme.

This programme was instigated as a direct result of concerns raised by our Campaign's independent safety barrier survey, undertaken locally, in May 2009.

Bedlam Bridge Safety Barrier Bid Update

Our joint funding bid for a further new safety barrier installation at Bedlam Bridge, was reviewed by the Fenland County Council Panel, consisting of 5 local County Councillors, supported by local Traffic Engineering Officers, along with other local scheme applications, on 27th April.

Alan Kinninmonth, hero of the May 2007 two-vehicle immersion accident in which he rescued two small children from the rear of a sinking vehicle, joined me to help present the case in support of our bid. The Panel members were highly complimentary about the technical quality and level of detail and fundraising aspects of the Campaign's bid.

We are hoping for definitive news of the Council's decision on whether they will be adopting the scheme, in the very near future.

Road Safety Campaigning Award for Fenland MP Steve Barclay

National Road Safety charity, 'BRAKE', and insurers Direct Line have named Steve Barclay, 'Road Safety Campaigning Parliamentarian of the month, for his successful work to have safety cameras reactivated at the fatal accident blackspot at Thorney Toll, and for his achievements in securing the UK's Roads Minister, Mike Penning's support for this measure and for this Campaign's bid for safety barriers to be installed at Bedlam Bridge, which the Roads Minister visited personally, in January 2011.





MINUTES OF THE CHRISTCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY 2nd April 2012 – MEMORIAL HALL CHRISTCHURCH AT 7:30pm

Present: Councillors – Nigel Russell (Chair), Jacky Wincote, Jill Bliss, Simon Freeland, Hannah Poole, Wes Poole, William Beswick and Will Sutton (FDC).

Stephen Cowell (Clerk) and 1 member of the public were also in attendance.

1. Welcome and Apologies

Cllr. Russell welcomed all to the meeting.

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. Yeulett (FDC), Cllr Cotterell MBE (FDC) and PCSO Martin Bogunovic.

2. Signing of Minutes

The minutes of the 12th March meeting were signed, by the Chair, as true record of the meeting.

3. Disclosure and Declarations of Interests

Cllr. Bliss declared an interest in payment 8.4 & 8.5.

4. Update on action points from previous meeting

The Clerk reported that:

FDC no longer has a Dog Warden but that they do have a Street Scene officer and that the Dog Fouling has been reported to her. FDC has agreed to review the signs in the Church Road area and put more up if required. They have also provided the council with some notices that will be put up on village notice boards.

The Clerk is in the process of reviewing the Council's banking arrangements and recommends no change at present.

Mr Horton has resurrected the village web-site and has agreed to put Council meeting minutes on the site.

FDC have reported that house numbering of Church Road will go ahead and are awaiting comments from the Parish Council regarding Upwell Road. Councillor Russell has spoken to residents and it has been suggested Street signs with indications of house numbering on those signs might help. **Clerk to discuss with FDC**.

Highways issues have been reported to Cambs County Council's Highways department.

5. Public Adjournment

The member of the public raised the following issue:

A great deal of rubbish is still being left on the field after football matches.

6. Police Update

The Clerk reported that PCSO Bogunovic has sent his apologies.

The report he has sent the Council has just one reported issue of suspicious cold calling to sell power tools in Padgett's Road.

7. Correspondence Received

The Clerk brought to the attention of Councillors:

Letter received from Elgoods Brewery informing the council of the new landlords of the village pub, Mr & Mrs Andrews, the Council members wished them success.

8. Finance

The Clerk explained that the Council has until the June meeting to decide whether it remains a member of CPALC. The Council is already a member of Cambs ACRE and the Clerk belongs to SLCC so it needs to decide what benefits it will gain from spending a further £277.06. It was agreed to carry the decision forward until the next meeting. **Clerk to add to the agenda**.

The following items were agreed for payment

- 1. Clerk's Salary £183.78
- 2. Postage £4.32
- 3. HMRC £137.60
- 4. The Heron £60.00 Hire of Hall £42.00

One additional payment was sanctioned, that being a payment of £180.00 to the Council's solicitors for work done relating to notifying the County Council of their views on the covenants attached to the purchase and subsequent sale of land adjacent to the Recreation Ground.

9. Planning Applications

Application F/YR12/0168/F, erection of an onion storage building at The Limes Scott's Road, was reviewed and the application supported.

10. To consider any required work on the new hedge boundary at the Recreation Ground

A discussion was held on options and it was agreed that the Clerk should ask the Grass Cutting Contractor to remove some of the large weeds.

11. Diamond Jubilee celebration arrangements

The Clerk showed a sample of the mugs. It was agreed that the Clerk should order 108 and notify the School that there is still money in the budget should they wish to organise anything else.

Nothing to report.

Raising of Village Concerns

The following items were reported/discussed:

Concerns about brushwood piled close to a resident property that borders the Recreation Ground. Councillors Wes Poole and Russell to attend to.

Cllr. Beswick reported broken glass in one of the Play Parks most of which has been picked up but some small pieces are still struck in the ground. As it is in a small area it was agreed that the best solution would be to dig the affected area up and replace it with turf from the outside of the Recreation Ground. Cllr. Beswick agreed to do this.

Councillors, Russell, Wes Poole and Sutton agreed to try and remove the base of the old roundabout from the Recreation Ground.

The Clerk was asked to inform FDC's Planning Enforcement team about the poor state of a property along Euximoor Drove.

It was agreed that the Council should write to Mrs Mills the outgoing editor of the Heron to thank her for all the hard work she has put in to making the newsletter so popular. FDC Cllr. Sutton said that County Councillor Yeulett has asked him to speak at the County Council's review of the Minor Highways submissions on the subject of one of the Parish Council's requests. Cllr. Sutton indicated he is happy to do this if the Parish Council is happy for him to do so. The Parish Council thanked him for the offer and agreed that it would be beneficial.

The Chair thanked all for attending and closed the meeting at 8:25pm


