Going Batty in the Village

With our current penchant for wildlife topics, I thought I'd share my latest "encounter" with you all. On the morning of Sunday 11th March, I was out in the garden when I heard a strange squeaking sound and saw one of the cats showing an interest. As I got closer I saw the animal making the noise was a bat! Knowing a little about what to do, I got Vanessa to get me a pair of gloves – as they do have rather sharp teeth – and kept the cat from getting too close. The kids found me a shoebox to put it in and then we looked for what to do next. RSPCA and local vet were unfortunately not a lot of help. Hoorah for the Internet! The Bat Conservation Trust (www.bats.org.uk) have a great set of links with what to do if you find one, identification help and "Bats and the Law".

I had to keep hold of the bat for about 24 hours before I could pass it on to a local specialist so Vanessa was sent to get me some mealworms. They sell them live in pet shops or dried from garden centres. If you feed them dry, then it's best to soak them in a little warm water first. We fed the bat using tweezers.

I handed it over to a local "bat rehabilitator" on the Monday morning and he was going to let me know how the bat was doing and whether it'd healthy enough to be released in a few days. It fed quite voraciously so we're hoping it was just tired. The bat was identified as a young female Pipistrelle, one of 17 species of bat which breed in the UK. We often see them flitting around the garden in summer evenings so it was nice to see one up close.

I got a phone call on the Wednesday that the bat was fit and healthy and in a suitable state to be released, so I collected her on the Friday lunchtime and successfully released her in the garden at dusk – much to the children's delight.

Basically – contain it, keep it somewhere warm, put a tea-towel in a corner of the box for it to crawl into, a shallow small dish of water in there as dehydration can be a problem and phone the Bat Trust helpline on 0845 1300 228 and listen to the automatic menu. It should now be manned 24/7 as we are into the main season.



MINUTES OF THE CHRISTCHURCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY 12th MARCH 2012 – MEMORIAL HALL CHRISTCHURCH AT 7:30pm

Present: Councillors – Nigel Russell (Chair), Jacky Wincote, Jill Bliss, Simon Freeland, Hannah Poole, Wes Poole, William Beswick and Will Sutton (FDC). Stephen Cowell (Clerk) and 9 members of the public were also in attendance.

Welcome and Apologies

Cllr. Russell welcomed all to the meeting. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. Yeulett (FDC), Cllr Cotterell MBE (FDC) and PCSO Martin Bogunovic.

Signing of Minutes

The minutes of the 13th February meeting were signed, by the Chair, as true record of the meeting.

Disclosure and Declarations of Interests

Cllr. Bliss declared an interest in payment 8.3.

Update on action points from previous meeting

The Clerk reported that:

- Speed Limit reduction consultation letters have been sent out and a notice placed in The Heron. So far two responses of support have been received from residents as has one letter of acknowledgement.
- An e-mail has been sent to Highways regarding the feasibility of dropping part of the kerb near the Old Shop to make it easier for those with prams and wheelchairs to negotiate the bend but as yet no response has been received.
- The Clerk continues to research options for a Council web-site. Mr Horton has indicated that he is prepared to continue to update his web-site with Parish Council minutes.
- Cllr. Beswick has discussed the proposal to give all children at the School and Pre-School a Queen's Jubilee commemorative mug with the Chair of the School Governing Body and the Governing Body of the School is in favour of the proposal. The Clerk has obtained the number of children who attend the School and Pre-School from the Head. Cllr. Russell suggested that children not yet at School or Pre-School should also be given a mug. The Clerk confirmed that the FDC grant has been applied for. **Clerk to order mugs.**

Public Adjournment

Members of the public raised the following issues:

An increase in dog fouling along Church Road. Cllr. Wes Poole mentioned that there is also a problem at the Playing Field.

The Clerk was asked to notify the FDC Dog Warden and the Police of the problem.

A Street light in Fenview is not working but it has been reported.

During a recent visit of the local MP to the School the issue of the falling School Role was discussed and disappointment expressed that a proposed housing development had been withdrawn from the planning process. Cllr. Wes Poole explained that the planning application will be re-submitted following a traffic survey.

The report he has sent the Council has just one reported issue a theft of a vehicle from Outwell that was subsequently burnt out near the 16ft river.

Correspondence Received

The Clerk brought to the attention of Councillors:

- An e-mail relating to a proposal to hold the Neighbourhood Forum meeting prior to some Parish Council meetings. It was agreed that Christchurch might be better being paired with Manea for these meetings rather than Elm due to the travel issues in getting to Elm.
- A notice received informing the Council of the pending ROSPA inspection of the Play Parks.
- Details of Nat West's Parish Council bank accounts. **The Clerk will review options and make any recommendations to the Council**.

Cllr. Russell brought to the meeting's attention the impending road closure at Stonea $(31^{st}$ March and 1^{st} April).

Finance

It was proposed, seconded and agreed by all to continue the Council's membership of Cambs ACRE and to take advantage of the 5 year membership for the price of 4 years. It was proposed, seconded and agreed by all to appoint Mr Ivan Cooper as Independent Internal Auditor.

The following items were agreed for payment

- 1. Clerk's Salary £183.58
- 2. Postage £8.64
- 3. The Heron £60.00
- 4. Cambs ACRE membership £120.00 Suffolk ACRE £874.32 (Recreation Ground Insurance)

Two other payments were sanctioned \pounds 206.25 each to Mrs Seaton and Mrs Negus for land rental. Cllrs. Hannah and Wes Poole declared interests in these payments.

The Clerk was asked to contact FDC and suggest that numbering of Church Road should proceed but to hold back with Upwell Road for the time being.
- 2. Large pot hole near Corner Farm, Tipp's End.
- 3. More pot holes in Euximoor Drove.
- 4. Poor state of the 16 Foot Bank Road near the junction with Padgett's Road
- 5. Cambridgeshire County Council giving their approval for the sale of some of the land purchased by the Parish Council from them to raise funds for the renovation of the Sports Pavilion.
- 6. Poor state of repair of some properties along Euximoor Drove.

Clerk to report highways issues to Cambridegshire Highways Department.
