Dear Readers,




We had repeatedly advertised to see if anyone else from our community would be able to support the publishing role. Despite requests going out via the Heron, notice boards, social media and word of mouth, no one was forthcoming. This coupled with our members own work commitments and personal circumstances, led to the magazine stopping in April. The break enabled everyone involved to have a rest, rethink and take stock.

We have in the interim carried out a survey, knocking on doors to find out what our readers thought. We wished to ascertain local people's views regarding continuing with 'The Heron' and to see if we could find any more volunteers, especially on the publishing side of things.


We knocked on 152 doors and 122 people gave their views. We covered addresses in Tips End, Euximoor,16 Foot Bank, Padgett's Road, Upwell Road, Green Lane, The Croft, Fen View, Brimstone Close, Crown Avenue, Wayside Estate as well as the Dun Cow, Breakfast club on a Friday morning and Coffee and Cake on a Thursday afternoon at our Christchurch Community Centre.




97% said they read the Heron




89% said they would welcome it's return

## Our intentions and relaunch of The Heron

I am delighted to be able to share that we will continue to produce The Heron. Six editions will be published each year, one every 2 months. You can then expect to receive 'The Heron' for the months of February, April, June, August, October and December each year.

The magazine continues under the Charities Commission constitution framework and over the next couple of months we will take the next steps to request to become a charity. We will be writing to all our stakeholders explaining the terms of how we can continue and seeing what role they would be able to play in the new set up. We really hope they will continue with their support.
